Consistency is key for tackling ill health in construction

When it comes to tackling ill health in construction, we know there's a lack of consistency across the industry. And this remains our key challenge – everyone is doing something different.

You may remember that at last year's Health in Construction Leadership Group (HCLG) summit, our CEO, Patrick Heath-Lay, launched our vision for occupational health in construction. In January we were at the Institution of Civil Engineers (ICE) Health Summit and were struck by how far the construction industry has come in recognising that health is as important as safety.

We heard a lot at the Summit about the health challenges the industry continues to face. We saw data on the cost of ill health to the industry and wider economy, the still-frightening statistics on levels of musculoskeletal diseases and occupational cancers, and the potentially negative effects of 'presenteeism' (coming to work despite illness, stress, etc., which often results in reduced productivity) on health.

In her remarks to the ICE summit, our Head of Occupational Health, Margaret

Grahamslaw, called for the industry to show unity in meeting these challenges. <u>Read the</u> <u>full story about the ICE summit »</u>

Changes to Employee Life Cover from B&CE

Our Employee Life Cover (ELC) provides financial protection to construction workers. It's an affordable benefit that gives peace of mind to employees. We've updated the ELC Rules to provide more detail about our requirements, so it's easier for you to make sure your employees will meet them.

Updated ELC Rules

When adding employees onto the scheme, or upgrading employees' cover within the scheme, employers need to be aware of the following:

• You'll need to declare to us that you have no knowledge of the employee having been diagnosed with a terminal illness (one where the expectation of life is less than one year

from diagnosis); and

• The employee must be 'actively at work' with you – this means:

- he or she is physically and mentally able to do all the duties of their normal job and is doing so (absence due to holiday still counts as doing their job); **and**
- the employee must not have been absent from work due to an accident or ill health in the 4 weeks before the start of the cover or upgrade to the cover; **and**
- the employee must not have reduced his or her working hours due to ill health or accident in the 3 months before the cover starts, or is upgraded.

What do you need to do?

These updated Rules will be applied from 1 April 2018. But the existing cover you have stays in place. We just ask that you comply with the updated Rules described above when adding employees onto the scheme, or upgrading employees' cover within the scheme.

Just a quick reminder that from 28 February you and your employees will only be able to access our website (including Online Services) using the safest and most up-to-date internet browsers – no matter what device you're using.

All secure websites are beginning to move over to something called TLS 1.2 – the latest version of TLS. TLS stands for Transport Layer Security, and it provides a safe, encrypted way of transferring secure data.
